The Marigold Project has been a great initiative in our community for 14 years! Each March children start growing the marigolds, and plant them at the first of June. The marigolds are there until the end of October. This project empowers our children – showing them what they they can do and how we enjoy their work. Cross curriculum learning is used, to enhance their math skills by counting germination rates. The children do art work, poetry, stories, science and environmental work. This project touches on all 3 ways we learn - hands on, visual and audio. Children and families are involved! The best thing to spend on children is time. Class size and class composition is very important to a teacher that engages children. We have a huge learning deficiency and obesity population in New Brunswick. We need to be with our children and engage them in their learning .

The Marigold Project has now grown to 50 sites in South West NB - wither over 2.5 million Marigolds planted in 14 years by tens of thousands of children.

Main Street has 40,000 marigolds, 1,200 children and volunteers to plant in 40 minutes. At the planting event we have speakers, songs, food, a parade and more. Other sites are also done in June: Grand Bay-Westfield to Sussex to Hampton, KV and all over the city! This event has won 6 awards in Japan, UK, US, Germany and 2 in Canada. We have 110 sponsors and schools. Our cruise ship passengers love this event. It's now become a tourist attraction and copied in Upstate NY and BC. Marigolds are hardy flowers and when "dead headed" they multiply multiply [it means Marys Gold]. This year we created a new logo & look for the project, with over 250 Marigold Bumper stickers given out.

We welcome everyone growing Marigold Gardens and Evergreens and creating signs with our message of Growing Children and Marigolds, to use our design. Judge each child one at a time and spend time with them. The marigolds are growing with our children in their classrooms.
